“There But Not There” Soldier Silhouette Unveiling Ceremony

On Wednesday, August 8, 2018, the City of Peterborough will unveil two soldier silhouettes in Confederation Square as part of the “There But Not There” project that commemorates those who fell in the First World War.

These silhouettes have been installed in public spaces across Canada, Great Britain, and the United States to mark the 100th anniversary of the Armistice and end of the First World War. The City of Peterborough has chosen to unveil the silhouettes on August 8th as a commemoration of the Hundred Days Offensive, which marked the final period of the First World War, beginning with the Battle of Amiens on August 8, 1918 where Canadian forces played a critical role.

The official unveiling ceremony will take place at 11:00 a.m. Wednesday, August 8, 2018, in Confederation Square and will include remarks about the project. All are welcome to attend.
